Looking forward to see you soon!



## Clicker Training Your Skye

#### By Shirley Deasy

Clicker training starts with an eager learner (your wonderful Skye) and a clicker. There are a number of clickers on the market but the one pictured below is the traditional model. When the center mental strip is pushed, a two-toned "click sound is made.

This method of teaching is what animal behaviorists call "operant conditioning". One way animals (and humans) learn is by association. When something happens, an action, event, etc. and something occurs (a consequence) then the animal associates the event with the consequence, pleasant or unpleasant. The more a certain event or environment is paired with a particular consequence, the stronger the association. Clicker trainers call teaching the dog that the click sound results in positive action by the trainer (food, play for example), "charging the clicker".

Clicker trained animals try to learn new behaviors. They remember behaviors even years later because they were aware of them as they learned them, rather than acquiring them without awareness. The dog develops confidence because he has control over the consequences of their actions. They are enthusiastic because they expect those consequences to be pleasurable.

#### Charging the Clicker or Teaching the dog the meaning of the CLICK

- \* Have a hungry Skye and your treats ready. Wait until your dog looks at you. If he is distracted, after about 30 seconds, say his name to get him to look at you.
- \* As soon as he looks at you, click and give your dog one treat. The click means "what you just did is what I wanted" for this to work, the click must be immediate and the treat follows after the click.
- \* Repeat 10 times.

#### **Pointers**

- \* Almost anything your dog really likes can be training treats. Use soft, easy to chew treats. Keep the pieces small. It is amazing how little you need to give to reward a dog!
- \* Do not let the dog snatch the food you deliver it with open, flat hand at your speed.
- \* Vary delivery. Sometimes from your hand, or toss on the floor, throw (some dogs love to catch it), or place it on an object. Be different keep it fun.
- \* Only put 5-10 small treats in your hand at a time. It is easiest of you are training in an room or area where you can do this off lead (a small space is best to keep attention), If you need to work on leash for safety and are

having trouble holding the leash, the clicker and your treats, try putting the treats in the under the clicker. Or put the treats in your pocket or on a table nearby. Another way to manage it all is to attach the leash to your pants or tie a long leash around your waist. But don't stress about being quick - remember the treat comes after the click but it doesn't have to come instantly.

- \* Avoid the dog's ears. The sound is loud and could hurt their ears close we want the dog to have a pleasant association with the clicker.
- \* Do not click AT the dog it is not a TV remote control!! Learning is quicker if they are concentrating on listening for the click, not watching your hand.

#### First Clicker Lesson

**Teaching Sit:** Does your dog or puppy know how to sit? Of course she does! You actually are not training her to sit but teaching a non-English speaker that the word "sit" means, I would like you to sit. If you are lucky, while you have the clicker and treats in hand, the dog sits – Click and Treat. If sit doesn't just happen, hold the treat just above the dogs nose and move it until the dog has to put its bottom down to stay balanced – Click as the bottom moves downwards -(don't wait until it hits the floor – you are clicking for muscle movement.

Do not say "SIT", until you know the dog will offer the behavior. Learning does not speed up because you give a behavior a name that the dog does not know yet. Wait until you can reliably get the behavior and then start associating the word (cue/command) with the action.

**Other First Lessons**: Any behavior your Skye offers can be his first lesson. If your dog sits or downs or offers a paw, all are excellent first lessons. Approach the training of any behavior like you are teaching a fun trick and your Skye will learn to love to learn.

- 5) What advice would you give to others who might be interested in the Skye?
